31 – Analysing Performance	Written Exam- Othello, Frankenstein and Live Theatre Evaluation	20% of A Level
46- Deconstructing Texts	Written Exam – The Crucible	20% of A Level

Component 11 Devising Drama:

Create a practitioner study on the following theatre makers: **Bertolt Brecht** and **Frantic Assembly**.

For each practitioner you should research:

Theatrical concepts, style, teachings and methods.

The historical, social and cultural context of the practitioner.

Key influences that have shaped their work.

Their own "footprint" on theatre: How have they changed theatre? Who have they influenced?

You should have two practitioner studies completed by September. If you would like to explore additional practitioners please feel free to repeat the task with practitioners of your choice!

Component 46- The Crucible:

Create a profile for key characters including details of: status; relationships with others; objectives and super-objectives.

Research Historical, Social, Political and Cultural Context of The Crucible (The Salem Witch Trials and McCarthyism in America).

Research the themes of the play and justify how these can be linked to the McCarthy trials and are still prevalent in our society today.
