

Purpose Clauses - guided practice

In the Latin: Find the 3 'stepping stones'

- put a bar line | at the end of the main statement
- hilite **ut**
- hilite **the *subjunctive verb marker* & ending**

In the English:

- the translation has been done for you 😊
(look carefully at *who* is doing the action – check the *ending*)
- put a bar line | at the end of the main statement
- hilite **so that**
- **I/you/he etc *could* (= *subjunctive* in English)**

a) omnes cives ad silvam contenderunt ut leonem mortuum spectarent.

All the citizens hurried to the wood so that they could see the dead lion.

b) dominus stylum et ceras poposcit ut epistulam scriberet.

The master demanded a stylus and wax tablets so that he could write a letter.

c) denique ego ad patrem redii ut rem explicarem.

Finally, I returned to my father, so that I could explain the matter.

d) pugionem rapui ut captivum interficerem.

I grabbed the dagger so that I could kill the prisoner.

e) equos celeriter conscendimus ut ex oppido fugeremus.

We quickly mounted our horses so that we could flee from the town.

f) villam intravisti ut pecuniam nostrum caperes.

You entered the house so that you could take our money.
